




There is such an event! And if you've been to Mustang Week in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, then you already know that such an event takes place every year in July.

Mustang Week began in 2002 as a small cruise-in with roughly 150 cars at Broadway at the Beach and Hard Rock Café in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. It has grown steadily over the past seven years, and 2009 is sure to be the largest to date. Mustang Week takes the word "vacation" to a whole new level. It's a week-long celebration of the cars we love—the Mustang and SVTs!

The Mustang Week staff has carefully thought out the week's schedule so that participants are able to enjoy everything Myrtle Beach has to offer, while still making it to all the scheduled events. Also, for only the fourth time in history, the Special Vehicle Team Owners Association is holding a national gathering designed for all Ford SVT owners during the 2009 Mustang Week. Just like during the previous three SVTOA Nationals, Experience IV will feature a car show, a club dinner, and a track event (Mustang Week Drag Night)! The SVTOA also has special prizes and guest appearances planned in addition to all of the other attractions that make Mustang Week one of the biggest and best Ford-based automotive events in the country!







Meet 'n' Greet Tuesday, July 21, 2009


















Beach has to offer. Most participants choose to get there a little early and stay the entire time; some choose to stop by for only an hour our two. The choice is yours!


Mustang Week: Day 2

Autocross Wednesday, July 22, 2009

We head over to the Myrtle Beach Speedway (www.myrtle beachspeedway.com) on Wednesday for some fun-runs and an autocross. The speedway is located just 2 miles west of the waterway bridge on U.S. 501 toward Conway, South Carolina. We included this event for the first time in 2007, and it was a huge success! In 2008, nearly 150 cars participated in the excitement, and we are expecting many more in 2009.

You can come out and watch all the activity as a spectator





(\$5 per person) or pay just a little more (\$20) and participate in all the fun. Gates are scheduled to open from 3 until 9 p.m. (Although this may change to allow more track time!)


This is a unique opportunity as the MB Speedway is a NASCAR-sanctioned oval track. Prior to the event, Speedway and MW Staff will layout cones to provide a safe but challenging line around the racetrack. Fun-run participants get the chance to go out onto the track one car at a time and take a few laps at their own pace. Staying inside the cones ensures speeds are kept within safe limits. This is an excellent photo and video opportunity, and an absolute thrill for the driver.

An autocross course will be set up on the track's infield during this event as well. The autocross course is set up and run by experienced personnel, ensuring safety and fun. Auto-crossing offers drivers the opportunity to test their driving skills on a flat, coned course. It will provide a low-speed chance to push your car's handling capability while testing the driver's skill behind the wheel. Both the fun-runs and autocross provide an excellent opportunity for participants to get a feel for opentrack, road course-style events.

The night ends with the annual Mustang Week Burnout Contest! Participants line up one at a time on the racetrack to light them up for the crowd.

One fee allows you to take part in the autocross, fun-runs, and the burnout contest. Be sure to watch the Mustang Week website (www.mustangweek.com) for details on this event.






Mustang Week: Day 3

Drag Racing Thursday, July 23, 2009

Thursday we make the trek back to Darlington Dragway (http://darlingtondragway.com) for the annual Mustang Week Dra Night! The Dragway is an IHRA-sanctioned track and is located







just west of Darlington, South Carolina, at 2056 East Bobo Newsome Highway in Hartsville, S.C., 29550. Gates will be open from 3 to 11 p.m. There is as \$10 fee at the gate for spectators and a \$15 fee for those who wish to take part in the event.

The Drag Night event is run in the test 'n' tune format, meaning participants can feel free to take as many runs as time will allow. This gives the driver the opportunity to try out their car and their skill on the quarter-mile for fun.

In 2008, we added the Mustang Week Dragnight Shootout and it was a great success. Participation is optional for the Shootout, and it will take place in between test 'n' tune runs. There will be an additional \$10 fee to participate in the Shootout.


The '09 Shootout classes are Street Car (naturally aspirated), Street Car (power-adder), Weekend Warrior, and All-Out. The Street Car classes are intended for those cars that can be daily driven, have valid/current registration and tags, run on DOT-approved tires that can be driven on the highway, use pump gas, and have proof of current insurance. This class includes a 30-minute cruise around the countryside prior to the first round of racing. The Weekend Warrior class is intended for those cars that can be driven on the highway, but are typically trailered to events and may or may not have valid registration and tags. The Weekend Warrior class may run pump gas or race fuel. The All-Out class is intended for individual and shop-owned cars that typically compete in a class such as an Outlaw class or something similar.

All cars and drivers are expected to use the safety gear

required by Darlington International Dragway (www.darlington dragway.com). The Shootout should provide the spectators with some really close heads-up racing excitement! Several Mustang Week sponsors and vendors, including Pro-Dyno [call (704) 651-3807 to schedule dyno time] will be set up at the Drag Night, as well.

Of course, getting to Dragnight is half the fun! A few participants and spectators choose to drive straight to the venue, and some will come straight to the dragway on their way to Mustang Week. Most will gather just before noon at the Hooters located at Myrtle Beach Mall near the intersection of U.S. 17 and S.C. 22. Soon after lunch we will kick off an informal hour-and-a-half cruise to Darlington Dragway. To most, the cruise to Darlington has become a yearly tradition! The Mustang Week Staff will hand out directions to the Dragway and answer any questions you may have. As folks head out for Darlington, people follow along in small and large groups on their way to Darlington. There are no official lead cars, so if you haven't made the trip before, find someone before the cruise takes off and follow behind.

It's exciting to see so many Mustangs and SVTs out on the road at the same time! In years past, there have been as many as 250 cars that took part in the cruise to Darlington. Needless to say, this provides some excellent photo and video opportunities. It also goes without saying that this many Mustangs and SVTs draw the attention of local law enforcement agencies, so please obey all traffic laws and have a safe trip to and from the dragstrip!

Car Show Friday, July 24, 2009

On Friday it's time to clean up your ride as the 6th Annual Mustang Week Car Show takes over Myrtle Beach Mall at the intersection of U.S. 17 and S.C. 22. The '08 show brought a sell-out crowd of 550 show cars and just over 4,000 spectators, and the '09 Car Show will fill up quickly—the '08 show sold out prior to the start of Mustang Week—so pre-register as soon as it's open.

The Car Show is open to all years of Ford Mustangs and SVT vehicles, and has quickly become one of the best all-around Mustang car show on the East Coast. Spectators and participants will have the chance to see everything from mild to wild and classic Ponies to late-models just off the lot!

Cars and trucks will be judged bases on the overall cleanliness and quality of presentation. We will look at the interior of the car, the engine compartment, the body, the wheels, and the tires. We will not judge convertible tops or side glass since they are optioned to be down during the judging period. We will not judge trunks. The people who win at the Mustang Week Car Show take cleaning seriously and it shows. The staff understands that you are not at home with all of your normal cleaning products and procedures. However, each year folks drive a long way to Mustang Week and still manage to get their cars really clean!

In 2008, I40 trophies were awarded, so good luck! For those






William Edward "Bill" Jones
